**2<sup>nd</sup> May    The Art of Your Life    *Megan Dunn***

Author Megan Dunn will give an illustrated lecture on the art that has shaped her life. From the early op-shop prints on the walls of numerous rented flats she shared with her single parent Mum, to contemporary New Zealand artworks by her peers, including photographer Yvonne Todd and painter Kushana Bush. Where does taste come from? What artworks have changed your life? Megan will consider the big and little questions in this frank talk about art and inheritance.

**9<sup>th</sup> May    Tourism, Climate Change and Aviation    *Professor James Higham***

Tourism is both an important part of the New Zealand economy, and a high carbon activity, particularly when it involves long-haul air travel. While decarbonising tourism has emerged as a critical challenge facing the sector as borders begin to re-open, the issue of international aviation emissions remains particularly problematic. In this talk James will consider the issues, offer thoughts on how to address the issues, and conclude with actions that all of us can take to contribute to the solutions.

**16<sup>th</sup> May    Old Hokonui- a Taste of Southland    *Jim Geddes***

Jim Geddes is currently the Head of the Arts and Heritage Department of Gore District Council. He headed the development of the Hokonui Heritage Centre in Gore, which features the Hokonui Moonshine Museum (dedicated to an illicit whiskey industry born out of 51 years of Prohibition). 'Hokonui' is a term used to describe illicit spirit made in Southland. It is also a term denoting the acclimatisation of the ancient and noble art of tax evasion. A museum established in Gore 20 years ago to celebrate this social history is undergoing a major refit – complete with an operating (albeit 'legal') distillery wing. This talk will be a guided tour through this unique project.
