6 October Faults and Earthquakes in the South.

Over the nine years that I have been Otago's inaugural Chair of Earthquake Science, my goal has been to understand the distribution and activity of earthquake sources in the South. I have now led earthquake geology projects on 10 Otago faults, had a temporary seismic network installed in Southland, and undertaken several consulting projects on dam sites and landfills. I will provide an overview of this work.

In 2020, the National Library established the role of Te Awhi Rito Reading Ambassador – a public-facing role to model, inspire, and advocate for reading in Aotearoa. Why was this necessary? The government recently announced that all vehicles will soon pay electronic Road Users Charges (eRUC). This will see vehicles pay for the roads based on the distance they travel and the weight of the vehicle. The technology to deliver this will ultimately be on/in-vehicle devices. This technology has the potential to allow us to charge differentially according to a range of things that could change how, where and when we travel.
