28th Mar What can seafloor sediments tell us about past climate change?

Assoc. Prof. Andrew R. Gorman

Sediments on the seafloor record the history of changes in environment as climate changes through time. Along the continental shelf off Canterbury and Otago, seismic images made of these sediments contain a really interesting story of change over the last 2.5 million years or so – caused by alternations between periods of global ice ages and interglacials like we are in now.

4th Apr Six sons and a seismograph: A brief look at the history of seismology in NZ

Thanks to George Hogben and his colleagues, NZ was one of the first countries in the world to purchase a standardised seismograph in 1897 and begin a systematic instrumental study of earthquakes. The hero of this history is the first principal of Timaru Boys High School, George Hogben CMG. MA. Although his was a short life, his story is full of triumph and tragedy but central to the early history of seismology in NZ. Come along and learn more about Timaru's (and Christchurch's and Wellington's) first seismologist and leading educationalist of the early 20th Century.

11th Apr Reading the landscape: earthquakes and active faults in South Canterbury

Dr Tim Stahl

South Canterbury hosts some of the most dramatic landscapes on Earth. How did they form? This talk will cover the tectonic setting of South Canterbury as well as some of the 'recent' geological events that have sculpted the Southern Alps and its foothills. Recurrent earthquakes on active faults are an integral part of that process. Learn how.
